

Prologis Completes \$920 Million in Dispositions and Contributions in the Third Quarter of 2015

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SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 6, 2015 [/PRNewswire/](#) -- Prologis, Inc. (NYSE: PLD), the global leader in industrial real estate, today announced that during the third quarter of 2015, the company completed approximately \$920 million in property dispositions and contributions to its investment vehicles.

"We made significant progress on our disposition and contribution plan in the third quarter," said Michael Curless, chief investment officer, Prologis. "These transactions allowed us to further pay down the short-term financing related to our acquisition of KTR earlier this year. Investor demand for high-quality industrial real estate around the world remains active, a condition we believe will persist for some time."
